- Provide a happier, positive learning environment for all children and staff to benefit their education and maximise their learning ability

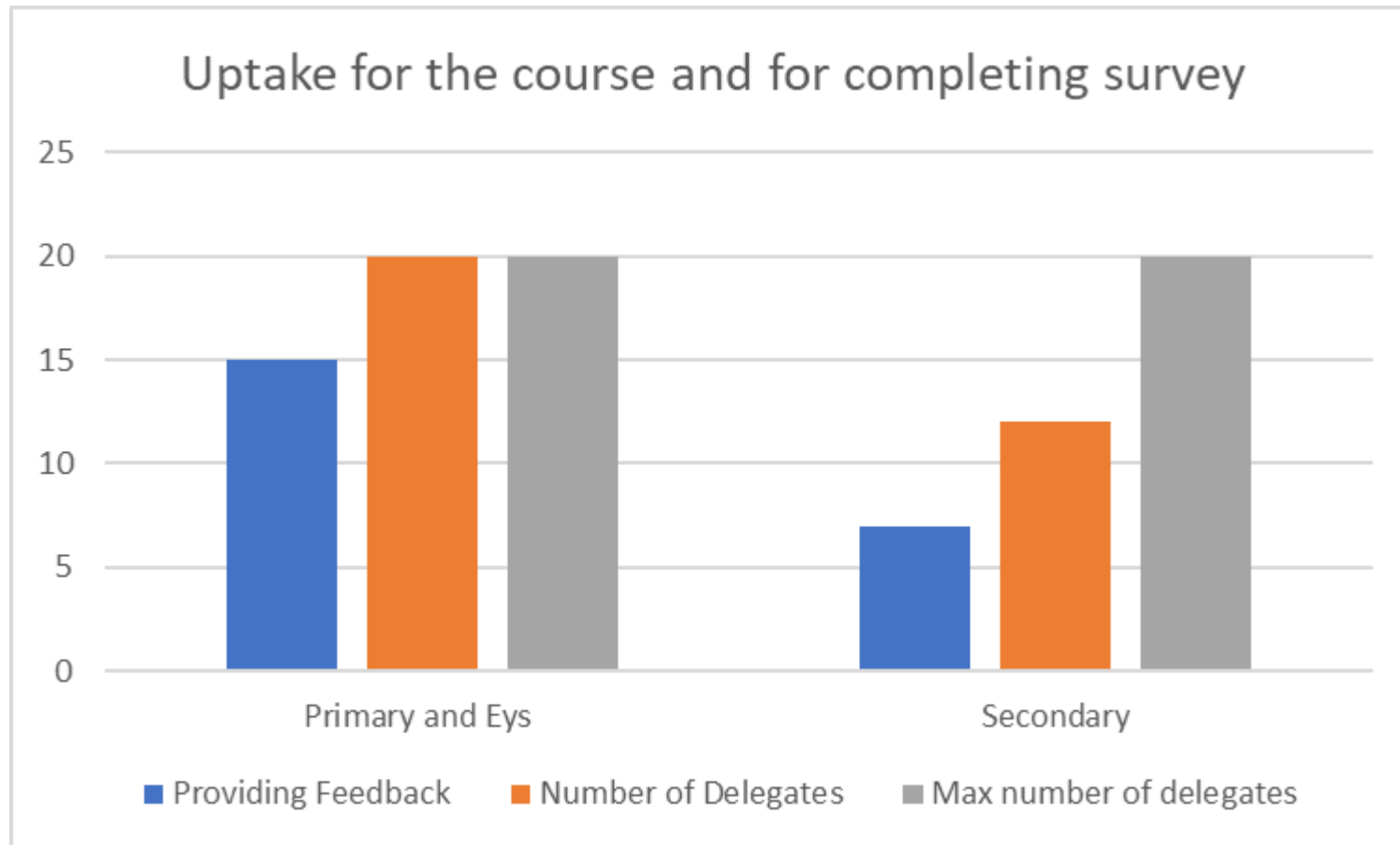
Impact will be measured through:

- 6 months after the training is delivered there will be a reduction in number of exclusions in participating schools by 5% on previous year's figures. (to be measured in July 2024)
