The number of pupils with special educational needs (SEN) increased to 1.49 million pupils in 2022, representing 16.5% of all pupils.

The proportion of pupils with a statement of SEN/ Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan increased to 4.0% in 2022.

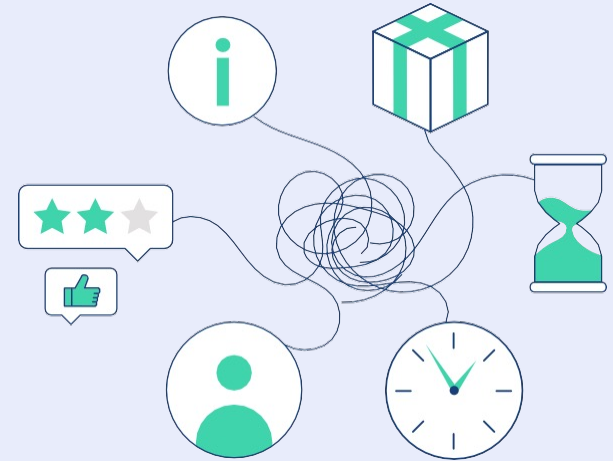

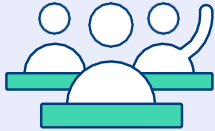
SixIntoSeven[®] guarantees the transfer of **reliable, consistent pupil data** between primary and secondary schools.

- Insights, patterns and trends to learn from

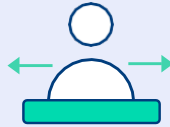


What does SixIntoSeven[®] do?

Enables early planning and resourcing for the new cohort.

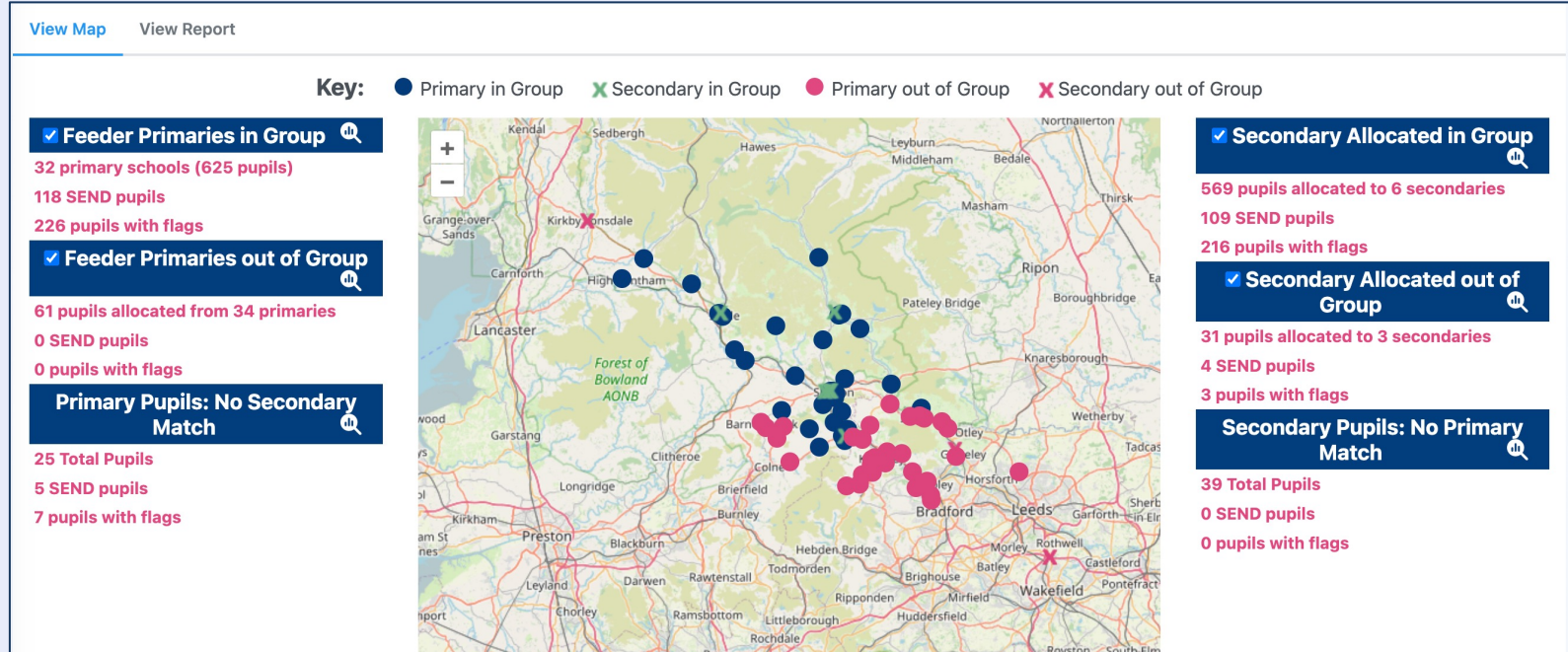

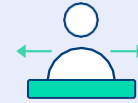
